

WEBBURN



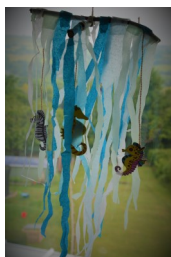
Wow Webburn, what a fantastic second week back. You have all been working so hard, both online and in school! This week we have continued

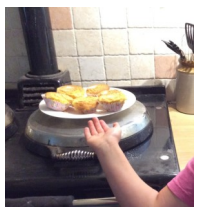
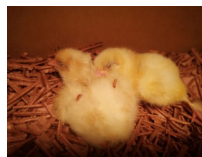
