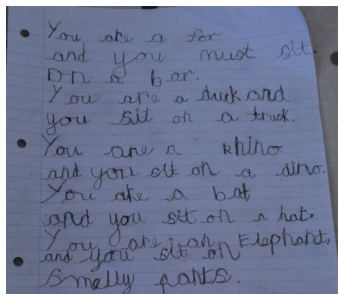


WEBBURN

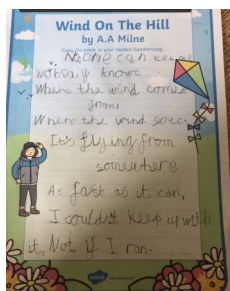

Wow what a week! We have been planning and writing a story in Upper Dart

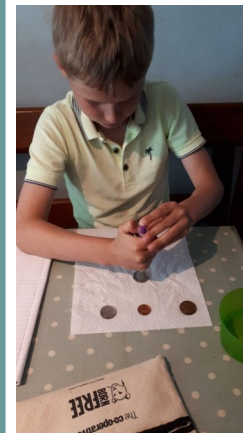


this week and this has been our main focus. I was impressed by the creativity and thought that went into the planning stage and the quality of the writing I have seen so far has been very high.
